A Lenten Study of Baptismal Promises

Plans are underway for a Lenten study, and you are invited. The study chosen for this year is *"Will You?"* from Forward Movement. From the Introduction of the study "The first three questions of our Baptismal Covenant are about belief, a restatement of our creeds. The last five questions, the "will you" questions, are about action, and these action questions are the focus of this Lenten study."

The book we will use is divided into five chapters with a focus on one of the "will you" questions per chapter. Each chapter is divided into seven brief reflections, which are perfect for daily engagement during the week. The reflections include personal stories, history, theology, and material from common church resources such as scripture, hymns, and liturgy. You can read a sample of the study <u>here</u>. We will begin the study on Wednesday, February 21. Please pick up your book no later than Ash Wednesday, February 14, so you can begin the daily reflections before our first night.

We will begin each Wednesday with a light meal at 6:00 p.m. in Creasy Hall. Our discussion will start at 6:30 p.m. We will share leading the discussion with the group as well as providing a light meal. A leader guide is available and will be given to the leaders. A sign-up sheet will be available in the Narthex or you can call the office during the week.

There's a reason I've grown to love January. It's... baseball season?!?

For thirteen years now, I have volunteered as an athletics chaplain with a college baseball team; the last ten years have been at Our Lady of the Lake University here in town. It started as a way to get 'out of the box' and minister to the surrounding community, and it keeps being fruitful Christian ministry, so I keep showing up and volunteering.

After several years of doing that ministry, I started to study how athletics chaplaincy is done, which eventually led me to doctoral studies at Baylor (currently in progress). I've learned a great deal over the years, and I will have plenty to say about it as time goes on. My Saints play on Fridays and Saturdays (unless weather shifts the schedule), so there's almost never a conflict with Sunday worship or with a church event. I try to go to all the home games I can and stop by practice a couple of times a week to build relationships with the players and coaches.

I've made the same offer to my San Antonio friends for the last several years, and now I get to make it to my new friends at St. Matthew's: if you want to come see us play, I'll buy your first ticket (and a hot dog)! We play home games at Missions Baseball Academy on the southwest side of town, and the schedule runs from late January to early May.

<u>Special Events</u> (Some dates to look forward to)

- January 24—Belly Laugh Day. Hope you had laughter throughout your day which rippled into the lives of others.
- February 13—Shrove Tuesday. (Really) Fat Tuesday Pancake Supper Shrove Tuesday comes from the word "shrive" which means to give absolution after hearing confession. So Shrove Tuesday is the day when people went to confession to prepare themselves for Lent, which begins on the following day, Ash Wednesday. The custom of eating pancakes began around 600 CE when Pope St. Gregory prohibited Christians from eating all forms of meat and animal products during Lent. So Christians made pancakes to use up their supply of eggs, milk, and butter in preparation for Lent. Sign up sheet coming soon. Looking for pancake flippers, bacon handlers, sausage grillers, servers, set-up, and of course clean-up.
- February 14—Ash Wednesday, beginning the season of Lent. Also Valentine's Day.
- March 10—Start Daylight Saving Time.

With the start of a new year RACAP, we will continue to help our clients and offer them hope. Our client base has grown drastically in the last six months Whether it's a food drive or monetary donations, we appreciate it all! Every contribution can make a difference!

In 2023, RACAP assisted 1,398 families. We fed 3,835 people. Cost for groceries was an estimated \$206,049.15. We helped 593 clients with their rent, and 442 clients with their utility bills.

Diocese of West Texas Annual Council 2024

Council 2024 will convene in-person February 22 - 24, at the Convention Center in San Marcos, TX. Clergy and lay delegates will assemble to hear ministry reports, conduct the annual business of the Diocese, worship together, participate in workshops, and share fellowship.

Pre-Council Meetings: January 25, 29-30

The Episcopal Diocese of West Texas will host three Pre-Council meetings for clergy, lay delegates, and lay alternates, via Zoom, in 2024. These meetings will be required for clergy as well as lay delegates and alternates, in order to practice using the online voting system and to review Council business items including the proposed diocesan budgets, resolutions, and nominations for elected offices of the Diocese. Good Samaritan Community Services Designated as Council in Action Recipient

Council in Action is a giving program that occurs annually in association with Council. It is an opportunity for the Diocese of West Texas members and Council participants to serve a community within the diocese, opening our hearts and walking as God has called us to do by assisting those in need.

In 2024, Council in Action will collect clothing items needed the most for the people served by the Good Samaritan Community Services (Good Sam) in San Antonio. In what began as a ministry of the Episcopal Church on the west side of San Antonio in 1951, Good Sam now reaches more than 4,700 individuals and 1,800 families around South Texas.

Good Sam actively serves as a place of change, supporting thousands who are working to improve their lives and overcome the challenges of poverty. Every gift makes a significant difference by supporting programs that enable children, teenagers, adults, and families to improve their lives. These services include early childhood and youth and teen services programs, as well as the only nationally accredited senior center in South Texas.

This is a wonderful opportunity for every church to participate in spreading God's love in a tangible way to those in need. Congregations are invited to bring the following items with them to Council 2024 in support of the mission of Good Sam:


- Infant shoes (sneakers) and socks from size 1-12.

Diocese of West Texas Celebrates 150th Anniversary

In 2024, the Diocese of West Texas (DWTX) celebrates a significant milestone, the sesquicentennial of our diocese. Plans are in process to commemorate 150 years of our rich history. Special event dates will be announced at this year's Council.

A special 150th logo has been created for use throughout the year and is reflected at the top of this newsletter. This beautiful logo, designed by Andrea Thompson, Graphics and Social Media Manager at DWTX contains the following elements:

In the upper left, the Alamo, cradle of Texas liberty, represents the planting of the Church banner in the new world.

- The star in the upper right represents the Lone Star of Texas and the star of Bethlehem.
- In the lower left is the lion of St. Mark, signifying the first cathedral site in San Antonio and the wild nature of Texas.
- In the lower right, the ox represents St. Luke the Physician and the cattle of Texas.
- Six capped flags remember the number of flags over Texas during its history with the seventh being that of the Church.
- Within the bishop's miter, a spray of lilies (for St. Anthony of Padua), and a field of bells (for St. Anthony of Alexandria) are reminders of the namesake of San Antonio, the diocesan center city.
- Pearls for truth adorn the miter, and tabs for the Old and New Testament hang from the miter.
- The motto, in Greek, from Mark's Gospel, 9:23, reads "Everything is possible to one who has faith."

A logo package will be sent to church offices for utilization in 2024. The logo does not permanently replace the current diocesan logo to be utilized beginning in 2025.
