Improvements Are Happening!!

Thanks to the money received from the land sale much needed improvements are happening around our campus. The church tower and east facing wall were power washed and painted. The tower included a step with special elastomeric paint which allows for movement without cracking. This is required to keep the tower we love dry and leak free. It was then given a final coat of paint mixed with algaecide the same as the wall.







The other improvement is a new concrete foundation was poured behind the church, on the side of Vellom Education Building. The foundation will hold a new, larger, and much sturdier shed to replace our old one which we have outgrown and is falling apart. The new shed arrived just as we were finishing the Missive. The old shed will be removed soon.

The first week scripture lesson: Mark 12:28-34 (NSRV)

HAPPY BIRTHDAY USA! Two hundred and forty-eight years ago the Continental Congress signed the Declaration of Independence from Britain. The celebration began with the ringing of the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia. There are many fun facts about all the July 4ths from 1776 since. For instance, July 4th didn't become an official national holiday until June 28, 1870, when the US Congress made it law. And it is estimated that 150 million hot dogs are eaten each year; enough to line up end-to-end coast-to-coast!

Also, of particular note as a consequence of the separation from Britain--the need to separate from the Church of England. So, soon after in Philadelphia, the ecclesiastical society of the protestant Episcopal Church in the United States (ECUSA) was formally organized. First drafted in 1784, the Book of Common Prayer (BCP) was ratified October 16, 1789, by its first general convention (read pg. 8, BCP). It was based on the 1662 English Book of Common Prayer and the Scottish eucharistic rite of 1764. Our new BCP was soon translated into many European languages, but also included Ojibwe and Cheyenne.
