#### More from Our Wednesday Evening Study

Well, we finished our book *Signs of Life; Nurturing Spiritual Growth in Your Church*. Across the theme of spiritual journey, we became acquainted with five principals most frequently found in vital churches (their signs of life): The Heart of the Leader, Get People Moving, Embed Scripture in Everything, Create Ownership, and Pastor the Community. At our Bible Study table we discussed, argued, revealed parts of ourselves, and of course realized that every reading of the Bible brings something new that eyes and mind did not recognize before. Each chapter brought validations to practices we have in place as well as many "oh yeah, we could do that!" moments.

The last chapter is titled-Where Do We Go From Here? We agreed there is a lot of life in our congregation, but spiritual growth is not a destination, it is a journey; a journey toward a deeper love of God and neighbor. The book began, and also ends, with a prayer from the Book of Common Prayer found in the services for ordination of a bishop and a priest, as well as in the services for Good Friday and the Great Vigil of Easter:

"O God of unchangeable power and eternal light: Look favorably on your whole Church, that wonderful and sacred mystery; by the effectual working of your providence, carry out in tranquility the plan of salvation; let the whole world see and know that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen."

The prayer reminds us that any signs of life come at the gracious hand of God, the one who graciously gives life. And in the words of Bishop David G. Read (Council 2024): "Nothing changes, if nothing changes."

#### **Our Patron Saint Matthew**

Matthew was another unlikely person called by Jesus to follow Him. Matthew was a Jew who worked for the occupying Roman forces, collecting taxes from other Jews. We are told it was not uncommon for tax collectors to "collect" extra for themselves. For this reason, he was despised by other Jews.

In Chapter 9 of the Gospel of Matthew we find a brief recounting of the call of Matthew. Jesus saw Matthew sitting at the tax booth and said to him, "Follow me." Matthew got up and followed Him. They are then having dinner together in a house with more tax collectors and sinners. The Pharisees saw this and questioned the disciples. When Jesus heard them, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners." (Matthew 9:12b-13)



Spiritual Retreats in Recovery provides a safe place to deepen one's spiritual journey – open to all in recovery from alcoholism or other abuses, as well as to families and friends affected by the disease of addiction. All members of twelve-step programs (AA, Al-anon, NA, CA, ACA, etc.) are welcome to share their

experience, strength, and hope with each other in a community of love and support, exploring what it was like, what happened, and what we are like now.

Retreat Leader Jody Guerra, LCDC, will guide us through the retreat's theme, *Strengthening Your Spiritual Recovery.* Rev. Andrew Green, Rector of St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Beeville, will be our Spiritual Leader, as Celebrant for worship services, as well as provider of topical spiritual insight and pastoral care. In addition to various break-out session offerings, ample time is set aside for individual exploration. All friends in recovery are welcome, and no church affiliation is required.

Our Mustang Island Conference Center affords warm hospitality, comfortable lodging, delicious food, and thoughtful presentations in this beautiful Texas Gulf Coast setting. While on-site accommodations are limited, commuters who lodge elsewhere may attend for the reduced Day Rate.

Registration opens Tuesday, September 3, and closes Thursday, October 3.
