Services like this one (called Longest Night, Blue Christmas or Darkest Night) are often designed with those who are grieving in mind, especially those who are navigating their first holiday without a loved one. But it is also for those who cannot go home for the holidays, for those who struggle with loneliness or depression, and for those for whom darkness and quiet and candlelight come as a bit of relief in the midst of the commercial Christmas chaos.

As the world continues the ramped up, frenetic pace in this time of year, this Longest Night service acknowledges that we don't (and sometimes can't) always feel the holiday joy.

The service will probably be small, and quiet. It will be 6:30 pm on December 19th in the sanctuary.



A New Year, A New Study

In just a couple of weeks we will remember and celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Then, usually just a few weeks later, we enter the season commemorating His death and resurrection. Fortunately, Ash Wednesday falls on March 5th in 2025 which allows us time for a new study.

Have you ever wondered who this Jesus was? Who was this man that lived in the first century? Then join us in January as we begin an 8-week study using, *"The Challenge of Jesus: Rediscovering Who Jesus Was and Is"* by N.T. Wright. The description of the book says, "Out of his own commitment to both historical scholarship and Christian ministry, Wright challenges us to roll up our sleeves and take seriously the study of the historical Jesus. He writes, "...Only by hard, historical work can we move toward a fuller comprehension of what the Gospels themselves were trying to say." *The Challenge of Jesus* presents an accessible introduction to the "quest for the historical Jesus" and why it matters for the Christian faith."



The study starts on January 8th and ends February 26th. We will meet in the parish hall at 6:00 p.m. The format for the evening begins with dinner (bring your own) and catching up with each other. Our discussion of that week's reading will start at 6:30 p.m. and closes with an Order for Compline at approximately 8:00. We share leading the discussion each week with the group. There will be a signup sheet in the Narthex on Sunday or you can call the office. In addition to signing up to participate in the study, we ask everyone to prayerfully consider signing up to lead one of the discussions.

Books were ordered and are available in the office. The cost of the book is \$15.50, payable to Diane Woods. If you prefer, you can purchase the Kindle book from Amazon.com for \$13.77.
